SUBJECT: Agreement with Riverside County Child Care Consortium for Child Care Capacity Building Services

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors approve and:

- 1) Authorize the Chairman of the Board to sign the Agreement between Riverside County Child Care Consortium (RCCCC) and Riverside County Department of Public Social Services (DPSS) to increase CalWORKs families' potential access to affordable licensed child care slots by expanding the total number of licensed child care slots available in the County, for the term February 12, 2003 through June 15, 2003, not to exceed \$150,000;
- 2) Authorize the Purchasing Agent to sign any Amendments which do not exceed the Board-approved allocation; and
- 3) Authorize the Director of DPSS to administer the activities and claim for reimbursement of expenses.

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BACKGROUND:

The State of California Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) program has one-time Incentive Funds available for the current fiscal year and has made a portion of these funds available to Riverside County DPSS. These Incentive Funds must be spent by June 30, 2003. DPSS desires to use a portion of their allocation to increase CalWORKs families' potential access to affordable licensed child care slots by expanding the total number of licensed child care slots available in the County. To accomplish this, DPSS would provide grants to existing, or potential, family day care providers to retain, or increase, the number of child care slots for under-served geographical areas, or under-served infant or non-traditional child care slots.

DPSS has contracted with RCCCC in other capacities previously. On August 26, 2002, a Request for Proposal (RFP) was sent to 800 potential respondents to acquire related services for another project. Letters of Interest (LOI) were received from 25 bidders, of whom 24 bidders were responsive and responsible. Of these 24 respondents, RCCCC was found to be the most responsive and responsible, and was awarded a contract to provide services to help increase the total number of licensed child care slots available in the County. Consequently, RCCCC would be similarly responsive and responsible to provide the same services for this program.

Therefore, the Director of DPSS requests the Board to approve the Agreement between RCCCC and DPSS, for the term February 12, 2003 through June 15, 2003, not to exceed \$150,000.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: No County General Funds will be required.
