
SUBJECT: Riverside County Nondisposal Facility Element (NDFE) Amendment No. 2002-1

RECOMMENDED MOTIONS: 1) Open Public Hearing to consider adoption of Resolution No. 2003-52, approving Riverside County Nondisposal Facility Element (NDFE) Amendment No. 2002-1, in accordance with Section 18766 of the California Code of Regulations. 2) Following Public Hearing, Adopt Resolution No. 2003-52 approving Riverside County Nondisposal Facility Element (NDFE) Amendment No. 2002-1.

BACKGROUND: The Nondisposal Facility Element (NDFE), which is a required element of an Integrated Waste Management Plan, identifies and describes, at a minimum, existing and proposed facilities, other than landfills and transformation facilities, requiring a solid waste permit to operate. Nondisposal facilities are also those facilities that will be used by a jurisdiction to meet its diversion goals. The Riverside County NDFE, which was approved by the Board of Supervisors on November 29, 1994 through adoption of Resolution No. 94-398, identifies and describes those nondisposal facilities that will be needed to implement the Riverside County Source Reduction and Recycling Element.

NDFE Amendment No. 2002-1 is an amendment to the Riverside County NDFE to include the identification and description of the Edom Hill Transfer Station, a proposed solid waste transfer station and material recovery facility that is planned to replace the Edom Hill Landfill when it reaches capacity near the end of 2004. This facility, which was approved by the Board of Supervisors on August 13, 2002, will be used by the County to help achieve recycling and diversion goals in the western Coachella Valley area and will require a Solid Waste Facility Permit to operate.



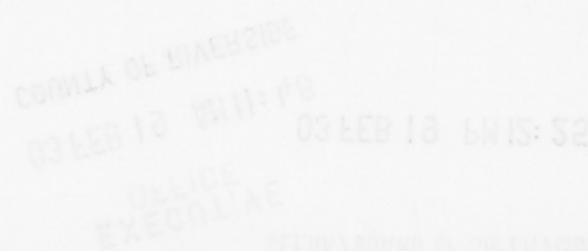

In accordance with California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) regulations, the Riverside County Solid Waste Advisory Committee/Local Task Force (LTF) must first consider the amendment to the NDFE before the Board of Supervisors acts upon the resolution to adopt the amendment at a duly noticed public hearing. The LTF considered NDFE Amendment 2002-1 at its meeting on November 21, 2002 and found that the amendment would not result in adverse regional impacts and would assist Riverside County in meeting its AB 939 goals. As evidenced in the attached minutes, the LTF recommended that the Board of Supervisors approve the proposed NDFE amendment.

The public hearing before the Board is being duly noticed in the *Press Enterprise* and the *Desert Sun* at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing scheduled for February 25, 2003. Within 30 days of approval by the Board of Supervisors, Department staff will transmit the County's NDFE amendment to each of the cities within Riverside County. Department staff is also required to transmit copies of the NDFE amendment to the CIWMB, along with a copy of the public notice for the public hearing, a copy of the resolution adopting the NDFE amendment, and a copy of the LTF's comments. The CIWMB has a 60-day review period for consideration of approval of the amendment to the County's NDFE.

The NDFE and its amendments are not subject to the environmental review requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act.

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RESOLUTION NO. 2003-52

**ADOPTING THE RIVERSIDE COUNTY
NONDISPOSAL FACILITY ELEMENT AMENDMENT NO. 2002-1**

WHEREAS, the California Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989 and subsequent legislation (the "Act"), being Division 30 of the Public Resource Code ("PRC") of the State of California (commencing with Section 40000), was added by Chapter 1095, Statutes of 1989 (Assembly Bill 939); and,

WHEREAS, the Act requires each city and county within the State of California to adopt a Nondisposal Facility Element ("NDFE") as one component of the Countywide Integrated Waste Management Plan ("CIWMP"); and,

WHEREAS, PRC Section 41730 et. seq., requires each city and county to amend its NDFE for all proposed, new, and/or proposed expansions of existing nondisposal facilities which will be needed to implement local Source Reduction and Recycling Elements; and,

WHEREAS, on November 29, 1994, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors adopted the Riverside County NDFE; and,

WHEREAS, on May 23, 1995, the California Integrated Waste Management Board ("CIWMB") approved the Riverside County NDFE; and,

WHEREAS, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors approved the Edom Hill Transfer Station on August 13, 2002; and,

WHEREAS, NDFE Amendment No. 2002-1 has been filed to ensure that the Riverside County NDFE accurately identifies and describes the approved Edom Hill Transfer Station; and,

WHEREAS, the Solid Waste Advisory Council/Countywide Local Task Force ("LTF") considered NDFE Amendment No. 2002-1 on November 21, 2002, and found that the Amendment would not result in adverse regional impacts and recommended that the Riverside County Board of Supervisors approve the proposed Amendment; and

1 WHEREAS, the LTF comments and recommendations are forwarded to the
2 Riverside County Board of Supervisors and to the CIWMB for their consideration; and,

3 WHEREAS, on February 25, 2003, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors held
4 a duly noticed public hearing to consider approval of NDFE Amendment No. 2002-1; and,

5 WHEREAS, the matter was discussed fully with testimony and documentation
6 presented by the public and affected governmental agencies; now, therefore,

7 BE IT RESOLVED, FOUND, DETERMINED, AND ORDERED by the Board of
8 Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in regular session assembled on
9 February 25, 2003, that the previous recitals are correct; and,

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors that NDFE
11 Amendment No. 2002-1 describes the Edom Hill Transfer Station, and that NDFE
12 Amendment No. 2002-1 has been prepared in compliance with State regulations; and,

13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors that NDFE
14 Amendment No. 2002-1 assists the County in complying with AB 939, the Act, and
15 promotes reduction in the amount of landfilled materials, thereby extending the life of
16 County landfills, and conserving natural resources.

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors that it hereby approves
18 NDFE Amendment No. 2002-1 and authorizes its submittal to the CIWMB for final review
19 and approval.

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors that upon approval of
21 the CIWMB, NDFE Amendment No. 2002-1 will be incorporated into the Riverside County
22 CIWMP at its five-year revision, if required.
