SUBJECT: Approval of the amended appendix to the Conflict of Interest Code for the Mt. San Jacinto Winter Park Authority

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors approve the amended appendix for the conflict of interest code submitted by the Mt. San Jacinto Winter Park Authority

BACKGROUND: Government Code Section 87306.5 requires that all local agencies review their codes and make any appropriate amendments to their conflict of interest codes, and the listing of designated positions for employees who must disclose along with the types of disclosure required.

The Mt. San Jacinto Winter Park Authority recently revised the appendix for its conflict of interest code and has submitted the revised appendix for approval by the Board of Supervisors as the code reviewing body.

This office has reviewed the revised appendix and has found that it complies with statutory requirements. It is recommended that the new appendix be approved and that the clerk notify the Authority of the action taken.

EXHIBIT "A"

OFFICIALS WHO MANAGE PUBLIC INVESTMENTS

~~All Authority Officials who manage public investments are included in and governed by this Conflict of Interest Code only with respect to its disqualification provisions. For purposes of disclosure, all Authority Officials who manage public investments, as defined by 2 Cal. Code of Regs. § 18701(b), are subject to the statutory conflict of interest provisions of Article 2 of Chapter 7 of the Political Reform Act of 1974 (Government Code Section 87200 et seq.). [Regs. § 18730(b)(3)]~~

Authority Officials who manage public investments, as defined by 2 Cal. Code of Regs. § 18701(b), are NOT subject to the District's Code, but are subject to the disclosure requirements of the Act. (Government Code Section 87200 et seq.). [Regs. § 18730(b)(3)] These positions are listed here for informational purposes only.

Consultants shall be included in the list of Designated Employees and shall disclose pursuant to the broadest disclosure category in this Code subject to the following limitation:

The General Manager may determine in writing that a particular consultant, although a "designated position," is hired to perform a range of duties that are limited in scope and thus is not required to fully comply with the disclosure requirements described in this Section. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The General Manager's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this Conflict of Interest Code.

EXHIBIT "B"

DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

The disclosure categories listed below identify the types of investments, business entities, sources of income, or real property which the Designated Employee must disclose for each disclosure category to which he or she is assigned.

Category 1: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that do business or own real property within the jurisdiction of the Agency, plan to do business or own real property within the jurisdiction of the Agency within the next year, or have done business or owned real property within the jurisdiction of the Agency within the past two (2) years.

Category 2: All interests in real property which is located in whole or in part within, or not more than two (2) miles outside, the jurisdiction of the Agency.

Category 3: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that are engaged in land development, construction or the acquisition or sale of real property within the jurisdiction of the Agency, plan to engage in such activities within the jurisdiction of the Agency within the next year, or have engaged in such activities within the jurisdiction of the Agency within the past two (2) years.

Category 4: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that are banking, savings and loan, or other financial institutions.

Category 5: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the Agency.

Category 6: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the Designated Employee's Department.
