SUBJECT: **FY02 FEMA Supplemental Grant Emergency Operations Planning designating Signature Authority Resolution Number 2003-126**

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board take the following action:

1. Authorize the Fire Department to submit a grant application on behalf of the County of Riverside Operational Area to the State of California, Governor's Office of Emergency Services requesting up to \$299,832.00 to update Emergency Operations Plans (EOPs).
2. That the Board of Supervisors adopt Resolution Number 2003-126.

BACKGROUND: The Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA's) 2002 Supplemental Appropriation has provided funding to the states to be sub-granted to local jurisdictions. The FY02 supplemental provides funding to assist local government in updating their Emergency Operations Plan for all hazards with special emphasis on Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) terrorism preparedness.

The Governor's Office of Emergency Services received \$11,937,008.00 in planning grant funds and is administering the grant program for the County Operational Areas. The Governor's Office of Emergency Services will distribute \$8,952,756.00 (75%) to the 58 Operational Areas and a representative of the Tribal Nations. The County of Riverside Operational Area has been identified as an eligible applicant and may apply for up to \$299,832.00.

The Riverside County Operational Area determined that the \$299,832.00 would be divided as follows: 80% to Cities and the County, 20% to Special Districts after the 5% administrative fee to the Riverside County Fire Department Office of Emergency Services who is responsible to administer the grant. Ten cities, three Special Districts and the County's Office of Emergency Services have elected to participate in this grant.
