RECOMMENDED MOTION:

2. Authorizes the County Purchasing Department to execute any future amendments that do not exceed the original allocation.

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, the City of Riverside has awarded Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to DPSS for a program known as Project Achieve, operated by the Institute for Urban Research and Development at the Family and Men's Shelters in Riverside. The goal of Project Achieve is to assist homeless participants in attaining self-sufficiency by offering services such as benefits advocacy, life skills counseling, and life skills training.

The City of Riverside provided this Agreement to DPSS on February 10, 2003. The term of the Agreement, which begins July 1, 2002, allows the County to charge any allowable expenses incurred since July 1, 2002.

The Board previously approved a similar City of Riverside agreement (for Emergency Shelter Grant Funds) on May 7, 2002 (#3.30) in the amount of \$118,750 for services provided at the Men's and the Emergency Cold Weather Shelters in Riverside.

FINANCIAL DATA:

No County funds are involved with this Agreement and no budget adjustment is necessary as DPSS anticipated this funding amount from the City of Riverside.
