**SUBJECT:** Golden Bear Awards for 2002


**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** Move that the Board join me in honoring the eleven (11) recipients of this year's CAL-ID "Golden Bear Award".

**BACKGROUND:** As the Riverside County Board of Supervisor's representative to the CAL-ID Remote Access Network (RAN) Board, I have seen first-hand the many crimes that have been solved by virtue of fingerprint evidence.

The Golden Bear Award, which has been in existence for seven years, seeks to honor those deputies, police officers and forensic technicians who have received five hits, or positive identification of criminals, from fingerprint evidence within the calendar year. The name "Golden Bear", originated in keeping with the historical theme of the State of California, is meant to signify the importance of Riverside CAL-ID within the state's identification system.

These honored individuals were responsible for the lifting/recovery of the latent prints, which were then submitted to CAL-ID and resulted in identification. It is a distinctive accomplishment!
