SUBJECT: 19th Annual Carol Addiss Student Drug Use Prevention Poster Contest (All Districts).



SUBJECT: 19th Annual Carol Addiss Student Drug Use Prevention Poster Contest (All Districts).

BACKGROUND (CONT'D):

The purpose of the contest is to give students an opportunity to artistically depict the ways in which they can enjoy life without drugs. The contest aids in providing students with peers who serve as positive role models by setting good examples and encouraging others to look at drug-free alternatives.

On January 6, 2003 students throughout Riverside County attending public, private and parochial schools, representing Grades Kindergarten -12 were invited to enter the contest in one of the following categories: Grades Kindergarten – 3, Grades 4 - 6, Grades 7 - 8, and Grades 9 -12. All entries were judged on originality, neatness, most persuasive use of theme, and how well the entry conveyed the message to others. All contest participants received a certificate of participation. First, Second, and Third Place winners in each category received an engraved plaque. The event was co-sponsored by the Department of Mental Health and the Riverside County Office of Education.

The Department of Mental Health/Substance Abuse Program requests the Board of Supervisors to formally recognize and present the awards the four First Place winners in each category. The 2003 Poster Contest Winners are listed below.
