## **PROCLAMATION NATIONAL COMMUNITY ACTION PARTNERSHIP AND COMMUNITY ACTION PARTNERSHIP RIVERSIDE COUNTY**

**WHEREAS**, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors received designation as a community action agency in 1979 and established a tripartite Community Action Commission comprised in accordance with the law, 1/3 public sector, 1/3 private sector and 1/3 low-income sector, to develop innovative strategies to move families out of poverty; and

**WHEREAS**, the Community Action Commission recommends the allocation of approximately \$4.0 million dollars in community for high impact programs as well as crisis response activities; and

**WHEREAS**, Riverside County joins its neighboring jurisdictions in support of the National Community Action Partnership's Poverty Rally and Tour in order to conduct "Conversations with America" toward the goal of ending poverty in America, consistent with the goal in Riverside County; and
