2003 Correctional Deputies of the Year

Correctional Deputy Patrick Webb is assigned to the **Blythe Jail**, and has only been with the Sheriff's Department for two years. In that short amount of time, he has become a lead person on his shift, become a training deputy, and has taken classes to support the classification deputies at his facility. This is quite impressive, and we recognize his initiative.

The **Indio Jail** recognizes **Correctional Deputy Ismael Munguia**. Deputy Munguia has been with the Sheriff's Department for three years and has become a proficient classification deputy. His bilingual skills are invaluable. He is a model for other deputies with his positive attitude and motivation.

Correctional Deputy John Watson has been with the Sheriff's Department since 1989 and is being recognized by the **Robert Presley Detention Center** for his diligence and initiative. Deputy Watson demonstrated these skills when he recently responded to a suicide scene. He coordinated the collection of evidence, assisted with interviews and made all proper notifications. In August 2002, Deputy Watson was called up to develop a "Rapid Response Profile" for RPDC, as part of the department Disaster Response Team. He is an exceptional deputy.

Smith Correctional Facility recognizes **Correctional Deputy Edward Delgado** as a highly motivated deputy. Deputy Delgado has been with the department since 1999, is a training officer and is a back-up classification deputy. Deputy Delgado continually volunteers for assignments, such as enlisting assistance from a variety of sources to make an employee exercise room; and conducting housing searches.

Corporal James Murphy has been with the Sheriff's Department since 1995, and is being recognized by the **Southwest Detention Center** for his dedication and guidance to their transportation section. Deputy Murphy was involved with the Los Angeles bus system for 22 years prior to coming to the Sheriff's Department, and his experience was invaluable in creating the transportation division of the Southwest Detention Center. Deputy Murphy can be counted on to maintain his composure when dealing with inmates, and serves as a calming effect to both inmates and his peers.
