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WITH ALTERNATIVES TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE**

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BACKGROUND:

On March 10, 2003 the Purchasing Department issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) for Anger Management classes countywide for Child Protective Services. Nine proposals were received and evaluated by staff from DPSS, Juvenile Probation, and County Counsel. As a result of this evaluation, two proposals were found to be the most responsible and responsive. DPSS requests Board of Supervisor approval of the contract with Alternatives to Domestic Violence for \$106,000 for the period July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004 with two (2) one-year renewals.

Alternatives to Domestic Violence is a private, non-profit corporation that operates the Horizon House, which is a 15 bed emergency shelter, as well as, provides a 24-hour crisis line, Community Outreach, Interagency Collaborative Agreements and Protocols, Volunteer Program, Community Education Program and Corona Family Violence Prevention Program, Professional Training in the workplace, Violence in the workplace, Legal Advocacy Program.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The funds for this program are included in the FY03/04 budget. No County general funds are required.
