**SUBJECT:** Approval of the First Amendment to the Agreement (DPH01K.072) with the Institute of Critical Care Medicine (ICCM).

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board of Supervisors: 1) Approve the First Amendment to the Agreement between the Community Health Agency / Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency and the Institute of Critical Care Medicine (ICCM) to extend the performance ending date from June 30, 2003 to November 30, 2003 in the amount of \$33,000; 2) Authorize the Chairperson to execute four (4) copies of the Amendment; and 3) Direct the Clerk of the Board to return three (3) executed documents to the Community Health Agency Contracts Administration for final processing.

**BACKGROUND:** On September 12, 2000 the Board of Supervisors approved the Agreement between the Community Health Agency / EMS Agency and the University of Washington for the study entitled "Early Access to Defibrillation for Victims of Out of Hospital Cardiac Arrest."

**Background (continued):**

Approval of this study has allowed the Community Health Agency / EMS Agency to implement a countywide program in which eight hundred sixty-three (863) volunteers from thirty-eight (38) locations have been trained to respond on medical emergencies and provide, if necessary, either CPR only or CPR with the use of an automatic external defibrillator (AED). For purposes of this study, volunteers at half of the locations have been trained to use CPR only while volunteers at the other half of the locations have been trained to use an AED with CPR.

The stakeholders of this study have determined that the study needs to be extended until September 30, 2003. As part of the Agreement the Community Health Agency / EMS Agency entered into a subcontract with the ICCM on December 5, 2000 to coordinate the Public Access Defibrillation (PAD) Trial Study activities in the Coachella Valley. The ICCM is currently managing 19 study units for this study. The current Agreement expires June 30, 2003. This Agreement will extend the performance date until November 30, 2003.
