SUBJECT: Acceptance of a Grant Award from the Department of the Treasury Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms under the Gang Resistance Education and Training Program

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors:

1. Accept a grant award in the amount of \$22,701 from the Department of the Treasury Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms for the Gang Resistance Education and Training Program, and authorize the Chairperson to sign all copies of the cooperative Agreement.
2. Approve and direct the Auditor-Controller to make the budget adjustments on the attached Schedule A.

BACKGROUND: The Department of the Treasury Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms has awarded the Riverside County Sheriff's Department grant funding for the fifth year of the Gang Resistance Education and Training (GREAT) program. A program administered through the County Sheriff's Blythe Station, GREAT teaches Palo Verde District middle school children about the hazards and pitfalls of joining street gangs.

The program is patterned after the nationally successful Drug Awareness and Resistance Education (DARE) model and utilizes school-based education, summer education and recreation, and parent involvement. The \$22,701 grant will be used to reimburse the costs of one (1) Deputy Sheriff assigned to present the GREAT curriculum materials to nearly 450 elementary and middle school students. In addition, grant funds will be used to provide travel and training for the Deputy and provide GREAT promotional materials and keepsakes for the student participants.

The term of the grant is from January 16, 2003 to January 15, 2004. This grant award was delayed following passage of the federal appropriations bill in late February. County Counsel had approved the grant cooperative agreement as to form.
