SUBJECT: Adjustment of Riverside-San Bernardino County Boundary Line

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve Revised Resolution Number 2003-243, which authorizes a minor boundary change between the County of Riverside and the County of San Bernardino.
2. Direct the County Executive Officer to notify the Assessor, Auditor-Controller and County Surveyor of this action and transmit this resolution to the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Bernardino for further action.
3. Direct the Clerk of the Board to file the Notice of Exemption with the County Clerk.

Departmental Concurrence

BACKGROUND: On June 17, 2003, the Board approved Resolution 2003-243, a proposed minor boundary change between the County of Riverside and the County of San Bernardino. Subsequent to the Board's action, it was determined that the legals and exhibits needed to be modified to address land ownership and right-of-way issues. The net effect of the adjustment is a gain of approximately 4.5± acres to San Bernardino County, as shown on the attached exhibits. Riverside and San Bernardino LAFCO(s), surveying and county staffs have met with the consultant, land owner, and affected districts and are in concurrence with the recommended changes, as reflected in Revised Resolution Number 2003-243.

The area that is to be annexed into San Bernardino County will no longer have coverage under the Western Riverside County Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan (MSHCP).
