BACKGROUND: The agreement with Inland Agency, covering the period July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004, in the reimbursable amount of \$171,353, continues the Health Insurance Counseling & Advocacy Program (HICAP) that provides counseling and advocacy for Medicare Beneficiaries and community education to the public at large.

Renewing this agreement with Inland Agency would prevent any interruption of services to eligible seniors of Riverside County.
