**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** 1. Move that the Board ratify the Agreement Renewal between the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development and Riverside County Regional Medical Center for the Period of July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2006, in the amount of \$51,615; to be received in three (3) yearly increments of \$17,205; 2. Authorize the Hospital Director to execute the Agreement Renewal.

**BACKGROUND:** The Family Practice Residency Program at Riverside General Hospital/Riverside County Regional Medical Center is one of the oldest programs in the state of California. It was originally established in 1971 with the idea of improving patient care access to family physicians in Riverside County and a goal of providing family physicians for the County's large clinic system.

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The hospital relocated to the new facility in Moreno Valley, March 1998. The relocation to Moreno Valley was strategically planned so the County hospital could be more central in Riverside County and provide even better access to the medically underserved patients in need of services.

Riverside County has one of the lowest physician to population ratio (OSHPD data) and is projected for the next five years to have one of the fastest population growths in the United States. Most of the growth is related to new immigrant populations.

The number of patient visits at the Family Care Center is approximately 22,000 annually. Thus, the residents, faculty and graduates of this program provide a significant contribution to the care of the medically underserved in Riverside County. The residency faculty works very closely with community-based physicians, receiving specialty medical referrals into our specialty clinics.

Under the direction of the Director of the Family Practice Residency Training Program at Riverside County Regional Medical Center, the grant funds received from the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development will require the training of a total of twenty-four (24) family practice residents in the fiscal years 2003 – 2006. Twenty-three (23) will represent resident physicians already in training, and one (1) will represent an expansion of the training program by a resident physician, each fiscal year.

The original Agreement between the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development and Riverside County Regional Medical Center was dated May 1, 1997, and approved on June 20, 1997. The State of California, Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development has requested the approval of this new Agreement Renewal with an effective date of July 1, 2003.
