**SUBJECT:** Local Government Public Education and Amnesty Grant Program Funding from the California Integrated Waste Management Board

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board of Supervisors adopt the attached Resolution 2003-451 authorizing the Waste Management Department to submit an application to compete for discretionary Waste Tire Grant Funds from the California Integrated Waste Management Board for implementation of a waste tire education program and the collection of waste tires from the public at Household Hazardous Waste Collection events.

**BACKGROUND:** The Waste Management Department (WMD) is proposing a waste tire education program and Amnesty Day Collection Event Project. Funds from the California Integrated Waste Management Department Fiscal Year 2003/2004 include the development and distribution of educational information to local residents and community groups. The WMD, together with the Department of Environmental Health, proposed five (one day) waste tire collection events in rural areas of the County in conjunction with regional Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events, in each Supervisorial District. 

Waste tires have been well documented as being illegally disposed in many parts of the County. This Waste Tire Amnesty Day Program may help to alleviate some of the illegal disposal that occurs throughout the year. It is estimated that one waste tire is generated for each resident of the State of California. That translates to roughly 1.5 million waste tires in Riverside County annually. At the current time, there is a shortage of suitable recycling facilities to handle all the waste tires created in Southern California. But through proper collection methods, we can ensure that fewer are disposed of illegally.

Many local jurisdictions within California have sponsored Waste Tire Amnesty Collection programs to specifically facilitate the collection of waste tires from the public. Currently, the Waste Management Department is conducting Tire Amnesty Day Collections in each Supervisorial District in larger metropolitan areas. This current grant will end March 2004. The Waste Management Department in cooperation with the Department of Environmental Health is proposing a Waste Tire Collection Program targeting rural underserved areas of the County which have been experiencing illegal dumping. This Program would run the term of the grant from March 2004 to April 2006 with the intent to continue the Program after the grant term.

RESOLUTION NO. 2003-451

**RESOLUTION APPROVING THE APPLICATION OF GRANT FUNDS FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT PUBLIC EDUCATION AND AMNESTY GRANT PROGRAM**

**WHEREAS**, Senate Bill 876 (Escutia, Statutes of 2000, Chapter 838) authorizes the California Integrated Waste Management Board to establish a grant program to provide opportunities to divert waste tires from landfill disposal, prevent illegal tire dumping, and to promote markets for recycled-content waste tire products; and

**WHEREAS**, The California Integrated Waste Management Board has been delegated the responsibility for the administration of the program within the state, setting up necessary procedures governing application by cities and counties under the program; and

**WHEREAS**, said procedures established by the California Integrated Waste Management Board require the applicant to certify by resolution approval of the application before final submission and consideration of said application to the State; and

**WHEREAS**, if awarded the grant, the applicant (Riverside County Waste Management Department) will enter into an agreement with the State of California for development of the project;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Riverside County Board of Supervisors authorizes the submittal of an application to the California Integrated Management Board for the FY 2003/2004 Local Government Public Education and Amnesty Grant Program. The General Manager-Chief Engineer of the Waste Management Department, or their designee, is hereby authorized to execute in the name of Riverside County all necessary applications, contracts, payment requests, agreements and amendments hereto for the purposes of securing grant funds and to implement and carry out the purposes specified in the grant application.
