SUBJECT: HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT GRANT AGREEMENT—VALLEY RESTART SHELTER

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors approves and:

1. Authorizes the Chairman of the Board to sign the attached Grant Agreement between the Department of Public Social Services and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for a Supportive Housing Program (SHP) Grant in the amount of \$135,874 for the period from February 1, 2002 through January 31, 2004;
2. Authorizes the Chairman of the Board to sign and ratify the attached Contract, HU 1459 00, between DPSS and Valley Restart Shelter;
3. Authorizes the Purchasing Agent to sign amendments to the Contract, not to exceed the maximum contract amount; and
4. Authorizes the Director of DPSS to administer the program with Valley Restart Shelter.

SUBJECT: HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT GRANT AGREEMENT—VALLEY RESTART SHELTER

BACKGROUND:

Since 1996, the County of Riverside has submitted a consolidated application to HUD on behalf of homeless project sponsors that provide services for homeless persons in Riverside County. As a result of the 2001 Continuum of Care Homeless Assistance Consolidated Application from the County, HUD has approved the Valley Restart Santa Rosa Supportive Transitional Apartment Project, and has executed and provided the attached Grant Agreement to the County for acceptance. However, significant delays have occurred in getting this project to the Board for approval due to conditions placed on the project by HUD regarding Mainstream Program Certification, which was not included in the County's Consolidated Application, environmental issues, and unresolved issues in the Sponsor's Technical Submission.

The Riverside County Continuum of Care Consortium develops and maintains a seamless system to assist homeless persons and families in Riverside County in achieving self-sufficiency and finding affordable permanent housing. For those not able to achieve self-sufficiency due to illness, age, or infirmity, help them find appropriate care and affordable permanent housing to the extent that they are willing to accept assistance. The Continuum's approach provides a comprehensive foundation for a service delivery system that provides a balance of outreach, prevention, emergency, transitional, and permanent housing with necessary support service resources to move homeless persons and families into the mainstream of society. The Continuum is made up of all of the governmental, non-profit, faith based and private institutions providing housing, supportive services, outreach, and prevention services to the homeless within the County.

On May 22, 2001 (Agenda Item 3.31), the Board approved a motion to submit an application for Homeless Assistance funds to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, which included a renewal project submitted by Valley Restart to provide a supportive housing project. HUD has approved the project and allocated funds shown in the table below.

Valley Restart Shelter	2 Years	<u>Santa Rosa Supportive Transitional Apartment Project</u> provides transitional housing and supportive services for families that have an adult with substance abuse or a physical or mental disability.	\$135,874
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Subsequently, DPSS requests that the Board approves and signs the Sponsor Agreement between DPSS and Valley Restart.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

No County General Funds are required. The budget for the two years is broken down as follows: Year 1 - \$67,937 and Year 2 - \$67,937. The total agreement amount is \$135,874.
