3. Authorize the Director of DPSS to administer the program.

BACKGROUND:

On September 5, 2003 a Request for Proposal (RFP) was released seeking proposals for the 2003-04 fiscal year for the Emergency Cold Weather Shelter Program (ECWSP). Path of Life Ministries was the only respondent for the greater Riverside area. They were judged to be responsive and responsible.

The ECWSP-contracted services during inclement weather would help the needs of the homeless and hungry people by not only providing temporary shelter and food, but also job referrals, basic life skills counseling, and assistance in obtaining various services aimed at self-sufficiency, such as physical and mental health treatment, professional counseling, personal care and hygiene, life skills counseling, education, and coordination with other social services agencies.

The Board last approved an ECWSP contract on January 8, 2002 (#3.29).

Therefore, the Director of DPSS requests your approval of the recommended motions.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Fifty percent comes from Federal funding sources (FEMA, City of Riverside Emergency Shelter Grant fund); the other fifty percent comes from the County's allocation. No additional funds are requested.
