**SUBJECT:** Acceptance of a Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) in Schools Grant Award and the Adoption of Resolution No. 440-8526

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** Move that the Board of Supervisors:

1. Accept a three-year COPS in Schools grant program award from the U.S. Department of Justice in the amount of \$125,000, and authorize the Chairman and Sheriff to sign the award documents on behalf of the County.

**BACKGROUND:** The Alvord and Corona-Norco Unified School Districts have agreed to share the services of one School Resource Officer (SRO). Each week the proposed Deputy Sheriff SRO will serve 3 days at Villegas Middle School in Home Gardens and 2 days at Home Gardens Elementary School. The two schools are within five (5) miles of each other. The SRO will work in partnership with the both Districts to provide students with a safe and secure learning environment, acting as a mentor to encourage the development of social responsibility and help prevent crime.

Due to severe cuts in the California budget, the Districts decided that they would divide the SRO position if Federal funds could be secured to provide a portion of the initial cost. District administrators contacted the Riverside County Sheriff's Department School Resource Officer Liaison to assist them with their proposal. The Liaison Lieutenant was contacted on June 9, 2003, and unfortunately, the COPS in Schools grant postmark deadline for submission was June 13, 2003. Therefore, the initial grant application was not submitted to the Board for approval prior to submission.

Both Districts have agreed to the grant conditions and both will be responsible for paying the full cost of services provided. The Federal funds will offset those costs for a maximum amount of \$125,000. The Districts will retain the services of the assigned School Resource Officer for one full fiscal year beyond completion of grant funding. The Sheriff's Department will return to the Board with an Agreement for this service before the service start date in September 2004.

This is the Sheriff's Department's fourth COPS in Schools grant award. Board acceptance of the three previous grants enabled the Sheriff's Department to place 16 Deputies on County school campuses (11/14/00 3.55, 11/20/01 3.48 and 12/10/02 3.41).


**Comments:**
