**SUBJECT:** Grant Award, Number D58 HP 00394-01 0, from the Department of Health & Human Services (HHS), Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA), for Riverside County Regional Medical Center (RCRMC) Family Practice Residency Program

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** Move that the Board of Supervisors ratify receipt of grant award, number D58 HP 00394-01 0, from HHS, HRSA, for the period of July 1, 2002, through June 30, 2006, in the amount of \$375,790, to be received in three (3) yearly increments.

**BACKGROUND:** The Family Practice Residency Program at Riverside County Regional Medical Center (RCRMC) is one of the oldest programs in the State of California. It was originally established in 1971 to improve patient care access to primary care physicians in Riverside County with an additional goal of providing well-trained family practice physicians for the county's large clinic system. The program's success in fulfilling this mission is attested by the fact that 34% of graduates over the last three years are practicing Family Medicine in medically underserved communities.

**SUBJECT: Grant Award, Number D58 HP 00394-01 0, from the Department of Health & Human Services (HHS), Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA), for Riverside County Regional Medical Center (RCRMC) Family Practice Residency Program**

**BACKGROUND (Continued):**

Riverside County has one of the lowest physician to population ratios (according to the Office of Statewide Health Planning & Development) and is projected for the next five years to have the fastest population growth in the United States. Most of the growth is ascribed to new immigrant populations.

The residency clinic (Family Care Clinic) provides a variety of clinical services, including well child visits, pediatric care, pre-employment checkups, maternity care, family planning, geriatric services, and comprehensive chronic disease management. The trainees and faculty of the program provide a significant contribution to the care of the medically underserved in Riverside County. The clinic provides approximately 22,000 visits annually.

Under the direction of the Residency Director at RCRMC, the grant funds received from HRSA will be devoted to the following:

- a) Development of a longitudinal curriculum for the homeless.
- b) Development of a community-based interdisciplinary Home Visit curriculum for the homebound elderly in Mead Valley.
- c) Development and implementation of a "Diabetes" curriculum geared towards care of the uninsured Hispanic population in Riverside County.

**FINANCIAL INFORMATION:**

The HRSA grant monies will be received in three yearly increments, as follows:
