BACKGROUND: (Cont'd)

There are two new services that WMD is seeking to offer the public. One is the addition of an ATM/Debit terminal at the landfill fee booths. The other is a copy service for maps.

In the past smaller, non-contract, incidental customers have been required to have the cash on hand to pay for their refuse disposal. This has caused issues of too large bills, insufficient funds on hand, and requests by attendants to have larger cash balances on hand. In many cases, invoices need to be mailed to these customers to collect balances due on their account requiring accounting staff involvement as well as the use of postage and office supplies. It is proposed, in an effort to better serve the consumer, that ATM/Debit terminals be available to our customers. These would be used to pay for the cost of refuse disposal for the smaller, non-contract, incidental customers. The service does require some additional costs that in fairness should be charged only to those customers accessing the service. The proposed .75 a transaction would cover the cost to rent the terminals (\$45 a month per terminal) and the transaction charge of the bank (\$.59). The ability to use the ATM/Debit terminal will save certain customers from having to leave the landfill to change currency and the department and the customers the cost and aggravation of future billing for balance due collections.

In reviewing the month of October 2003, there were over 20,000 cash customers. If only 10% of these customers access the ATM/Debit machine, the cost of renting the machines, training staff, and the transaction fee would be covered. In addition, the time spent compiling and tracking small balance dues and late payments will be able to be put to more productive use.

In November 2003, WMD purchased a new plotter printer. The new printer allows the department to produce professional quality map prints for consultants, contractors, and others at a size and speed that is appropriate for the user. WMD is establishing rates for the new printer and updating the copy rates for other printing services that have been available through the department and not updated for several years.
