Subject: Approve Agreement No. 03-76028 for the Lead Hazard Reduction Compliance and Enforcement Program (LHRC&EP), between the State Department of Health Services and Community Health Agency.

BACKGROUND: (Continued).

In October of 2002, the Governor signed into law SB 460 which became effective January 1, 2003. SB 460, entitled "Lead Abatement", made several changes to the California Civil Code (Section 1941.1) and Health and Safety Code (Sections 17961, 17980, 124130 and 105251-57) which codified lead-based paint hazards as an actionable violation of housing code. It also granted authority to local health departments, environmental health departments and code enforcement authorities to solely or jointly enforce the abatement of lead paint hazards, with emphasis on abating hazards in the home environment of lead poisoned children. It also established penalties for those who create, or refuse to abate, lead paint hazards.

These funds are being offered by the State to assist with the implementation of SB 460 in Riverside County. The Riverside County Community Health Agency, Office of Industrial Hygiene (OIH) will serve as the lead agency and central coordinator for program activities. In this capacity, OIH will serve as a technical consultant and provide education to Code Enforcement entities, develop a tiered enforcement strategy to achieve abatement of lead-based paint hazards and assist violators in achieving compliance via outreach and education.

Financial Data:

This agreement was not received until late March 2004. Due to the changes in the State Government, the award was delayed substantially.

Funding had already been included in the 03/04 budget, and is in the CHA proposed 04/05 budget.
