SUBJECT: Submission of a COPS in Schools Program Grant Application

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve the submission of an application to the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services-COPS in Schools Program for a three-year grant in the amount of \$500,000, and authorize the Sheriff to sign the Memorandum of Understanding and the Sheriff and the Chairperson to sign the application documents on behalf of the Board.
2. Per the grant requirements, agree to retain four Deputies/ School Resource Officers (SROs) proposed in the Sheriff's Department grant request, for one full fiscal year beyond the fiscal year in which the last grant revenue drawdown occurs.

The Sheriff's Department has been awarded four COPS in Schools grants, which have enabled it to place 16 SROs on County school campuses, and a 17th Deputy starts in September 2004 (11/14/00 3.55, 11/20/01 3.48, 2/10/02 3.41 and 11/25/03 3.42). Currently, SROs serve in the following school districts: Coachella Valley, Desert Sands, Hemet, Jurupa, Lake Elsinore, Palo Verde (Blythe) and Val Verde. In September, the Department will begin a partnership with the Alvord and Corona-Norco school districts, which will share the service of one SRO.

The current application would add two SROs in the Perris Union High School District, one in the Moreno Valley Unified School District and one in the Desert Sands Unified School District. As part of the application, each District Superintendent has executed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), which details the prospective services and responsibilities that the Sheriff's Department proposes to assume under a future Agreement. The Sheriff's Department agrees to reimburse the Districts from grant funds. However, each District is ultimately responsible for the cost of all services provided. **Implementation of this grant project will not result in a Net County cost.** In addition, the MOU specifies the responsibility of both the Sheriff's Department and each District to retain these SROs for one full fiscal year beyond the fiscal year in which the last grant drawdown occurs. County Counsel has approved the MOU and grant application paperwork as to form.

If grant funding is approved and accepted by the County, the Sheriff's Department will draft a formal Agreement with each District for approval and execution by the Board. Upon Board acceptance of a grant award, the Department will also request approval for the addition of all four Deputies.
