3.6 Basic Responsibilities of Medical Staff Membership (Page 6)

Members of the medical staff shall:

- (a) Provide patients with care at the generally recognized professional level of quality and efficiency established by the hospital's medical staff.
- (b) Retain responsibility within the area of professional competence for the continuous care and supervision of patients at the hospital for whom providing services, or arrange for a suitable alternative physician, who is on the Active staff with equivalent clinical privileges, to assure such care and supervision.

3.9. Leave of Absence (Page 9)

3.9-1 **Leave Status.** A leave of absence may be considered upon the written request of a medical staff member, excluding a provisional staff member. A leave of absence may be granted for not more than two (2) years. On no condition will a leave of absence be granted beyond two years.

10. Clinical Departments and Divisions (Page 48)

10.2 **Designation.** The departments and divisions are: (c) Family Medicine Practice

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Rule 9. Graduate Education Programs: The following shall apply to the hospital's graduate education programs:

- (g) The Family Medicine Practice chair may assign residents to serve on medical staff committees. The FM residents will serve on committees without the power to vote, unless otherwise specified in the Medical Staff Committees and Functions Manual.

Rule 31. Sterilization. The Obstetric-Gynecology Department, Family Medicine Practice, and the Urology Division will each have a policy regarding sterilization that will include appropriate informed consent, and it will also comply with all existing state and federal statues pertaining to this procedure.
