PROCLAMATION

RECOGNIZING JULY 18 – 24, 2004, AS NATIONAL PROBATION, PAROLE, AND COMMUNITY SUPERVISION WEEK

WHEREAS, Probation, Parole and Community Supervision Officers work in partnership with community agencies and groups to provide services, support, and protection for victims and others, while holding offenders accountable; and

WHEREAS, according to the Bureau of Justice Statistics, as of December 31, 2003, there were 4.1 million men and women on Probation and Parole (excluding juveniles on community supervision), and only tens of thousands of officers working to ensure public safety, and

WHEREAS, these officers are an essential part of the criminal and juvenile justice system who protect the community and assist both adult and juvenile offenders in complying with court orders and becoming contributing members of society; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors recognizes and proclaims July 18 through July 24, 2004, as "National Probation, Parole, and Community Supervision Officers' Week" in Riverside County and honors the officers who are on the front lines working with the offenders who work and live in our communities.
