SUBJECT: California Prevention Summit 2004

BACKGROUND (CONT'D):

This summit is a joint effort between the Riverside County Department of Mental Health, Substance Abuse Program and the California Prevention Collaborative, with representatives from communities as well as local and state governments.

The prevention summit will be an occasion for information dissemination, sharing of knowledge, and promotion of constructive and healthy alternatives to alcohol, tobacco, and other drug use. It will emphasize youth involvement. The Prevention Summit will provide an opportunity to educate and inspire youth, school administrators, educators, law enforcement officials, community coalitions, county alcohol and other drug administrators, and community members to work on alcohol, tobacco and drug problems in their communities and will result in a more competent workforce.

The summit's theme "Prism of Prevention" expresses the project's commitment to identifying high quality prevention strategies that align best with particular settings in order to more effectively combat alcohol, tobacco and drug related problems. Participants will be able to learn from and be inspired by experts as well as peers. By targeting prevention providers from an array of systems, the summit will be able to spotlight a multitude of prevention approaches that will result in the creation of a more knowledgeable and properly trained prevention workforce.

The period of performance for this agreement is June 30, 2004 through December 31, 2004 and no county funds are required.

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
