**SUBJECT:** Approval of Federal Juvenile Justice Challenge Activities Funding Application and Adoption of Resolution No. 2004-327.

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** Approve the attached application for Federal Juvenile Justice Challenge Activities Funding and adopt Resolution Number 2004-327.

**BACKGROUND:** The State Board of Corrections (BOC) has allocated to the counties \$1.75 million in Federal Juvenile Justice Challenge Funding, which is available for the period July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005. Based on relative county populations, Riverside County can apply for \$81,907.

One of the options for use of the funding is to augment the programs approved under the Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act (JJCPA), restoring some of the resource that was lost when the JJCPA funding was reduced by the State. The \$81,907 will augment the JJCPA Plan by funding the salary and benefits, and some support costs, of a probation officer on the Temecula Youth Accountability Team; this is one of the components recommended by the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council in their review of the JJCPA plan on April 27, 2004. This enables redirection of \$81,907 of the JJCPA allocation to help fund the Riverside Police Department's Project BRIDGE as part of the JJCPA Program (Agenda Item 3.35, 6/22/04). Per BOC guidelines, Probation submitted the attached application; it has been tentatively approved by BOC, pending approval and adoption of the resolution by your Board.

3 RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE  
4 COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE, STATE OF CALIFORNIA,  
5 AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR JUVENILE CHALLENGE ACTIVITIES FUNDING  
6 AUGMENTATION FOR THE COMPREHENSIVE MULTI-AGENCY JUVENILE JUSTICE PLAN

7 WHEREAS, the County of Riverside desires to undertake certain projects  
8 using funds made available through the Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act,  
9 administered by the California Board of Corrections, and to augment these  
10 projects with Federal Juvenile Justice Challenge Funding; now, therefore,

11 BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of  
12 Riverside, State of California, in regular session assembled on ~~July 13, 2004~~  
13 that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside does hereby:

- 14 1. Authorize the Chief Probation Officer to submit Riverside County's  
15 Application for Federal Juvenile Justice Challenge Funding and related  
16 contracts, amendments, or extensions with the State of California;
- 17 2. Assure that the Federal Juvenile Justice Challenge Funding component of  
18 the County of Riverside Comprehensive Multi-Agency Juvenile Justice Plan  
19 has been developed, reviewed and provided to the Board of Corrections in  
20 a format determined by the Board of Corrections;
- 21 3. Assure that the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors and the  
22 Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council have reviewed and approve the  
23 Federal Juvenile Justice Challenge Funding component of the County's  
24 Comprehensive Multi-Agency Juvenile Justice Plan;
- 25 4. Agree that any liability arising out of the performance of this Grant  
26 Award Agreement, including civil court actions for damages, shall be the  
responsibility of the grant recipient and the authorizing agency and  
that the State of California and BOC disclaim responsibility for any  
such liability; and
5. Assure that the County of Riverside will adhere to the requirements of

1 the Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act (Chapters 353 and 475 of the  
2 Government Code) and the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act  
3 of 1974, as amended, regarding the submission of the Comprehensive  
4 Multi-Agency Juvenile Justice Plan application or revision, investment  
5 of allocated monies, including any interest earnings, expenditure of  
6 said funds, and the submission of required reports to the Board of  
7 Corrections.  
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
