SUBJECT: Approval of Third Amendment to the Agreement with the City of Riverside Police Department for FY 2004/05 Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act Services.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Approve Amendment No. 3 to the Interagency MOU with the City of Riverside for Project BRIDGE and authorize the Chairman to execute the amendment.

BACKGROUND: The Multi-agency Comprehensive Juvenile Justice Plan for FY 2004/05 was approved by the Board on June 22, 2004 (Agenda Item 3.55). The current plan includes continuation of three major programs through 2004/05: (1) Youth Accountability Teams (YAT) made up of probation and law enforcement officers, deputy district attorneys and contracted counseling services; (2) Youth Accountability Boards; and (3) Juvenile Street Gang Prevention/Intervention through the Riverside Police Department's Project BRIDGE. The attached amendment in the amount of \$125,000 will continue support for Project BRIDGE through June 30, 2005. The decrease in funding from \$310,000 in FY 2003/04 was a result of the reduction in the statewide JJCPA funding.

BACKGROUND (continued)

When the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Counsel met in late April they recommended support for Project BRIDGE be discontinued in FY 2004/05 in response to the County's reduced JJCPA allocation. However, \$125,000 was made possible when the Board approved the Federal Juvenile Justice Challenge Activities Grant on July 13, 2004 (Agenda Item 3.34), allowing restoration of some of the resources that were lost when the State reduced JJCPA funding. The Riverside Police Department will continue the program using this allocation from the County in addition to other available grant sources.

The attached amendment has been approved as to form by the Office of County Counsel.
