**SUBJECT:** 04/05 Office of Traffic Safety Grant Award

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board:

- 1) Accept the 04/05 Office of Traffic Safety grant award in the amount of \$334,089 to purchase fire and rescue tools and equipment;
- 2) Authorize the Purchasing Agent to enter into fire and rescue equipment contracts up to the aggregate amount of \$334,089; and
- 3) Authorize the Auditor Controller to make the budget adjustments shown on Schedule A.

**BACKGROUND:** In recent years, Riverside County has experienced a 4.64 percent increase in the number of traffic collisions. To reduce the number of associated injuries and fatalities, County Fire was awarded a \$334,089 grant from the Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) to purchase fire rescue tools and equipment for multiple Riverside County emergency management services (EMS) agencies, city and volunteer fire stations, and Idyllwild Fire Protection District.

These fire rescue tools and equipment would provide emergency medical treatment and extrication of traffic safety victims support in the communities and surrounding areas of Temecula, Sycamore Creek, Banning, Blythe, Poppet Flats, and Woodcrest. Fifty-three (53) percent of the grant award or \$179,020 is for Riverside County Fire Stations. The remaining 47 percent of the grant award is a combination of pass through funding for other city and volunteer fire stations and Idyllwild Fire Protection district.

County Counsel has approved the OTS grant agreement as to form.

Financial Information: There is no financial impact for the County. 100% State funds will be used to purchase the rescue tools and equipment.
