SUBJECT: Acceptance of a Grant Award from the Bureau of Justice Assistance of the U.S. Department of Justice, under the Gang Resistance Education and Training Program

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors:

1. Accept a grant award in the amount of \$22,701 from the Bureau of Justice Assistance of the U.S. Department of Justice for the Gang Resistance Education and Training Program, and authorize the Chairperson to sign all copies of the grant award Agreement.
2. Approve and direct the Auditor-Controller to make the budget adjustments on the attached Schedule A.

BACKGROUND: The Blythe Station of the Riverside County Sheriff's Department has been awarded funds for the sixth year of a project aimed at preventing middle school students from gang involvement. The project, titled Gang Resistance Education and Training (GREAT), targets these students with information about the hazards of gang participation. The project also provides initial gang awareness training to students in the early elementary grades. The program involves law enforcement, parents, school personnel and the community. The project in Blythe will support a portion of the costs for the Deputy Sheriff who works with nearly 500 elementary and middle school students during the academic year. Funds also provide incentives for students, including field trips, and promotional items such as t-shirts, pencils and drinking cups.

The 2004 grant application process was a marked change from prior years. GREAT was transferred from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms to the Bureau of Justice Assistance. Only those agencies with a program in 2003 were invited to apply and only for the funding available in 2003. Due to problems with grant appropriations early in the fiscal year, it was not until mid-August that "conditional" award letters were sent to applicant agencies, and mid-September before the County received final confirmation of the award. County Counsel has approved the grant award documents as to form. All funds awarded must be spent prior to December 31, 2004.
