SUBJECT: Agreement for the Sheriff's Provision of Security Services to the Superior Court of California

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors approve the Security Services Agreement with the Riverside County Superior Court of California, and authorize the Sheriff to execute the Agreement on behalf of the Board.

BACKGROUND: The Sheriff's Department is required by law to provide security services to the Superior Court. Per AB 233, the State of California is responsible for the cost of court operations, including reimbursement for the Sheriff's service costs. In April 1999, the Sheriff's Department and the Superior Court entered into an Agreement detailing the level of court security services, the establishment of services costs and terms of payment. With the enactment of the Superior Court Law Enforcement Act of 2002 (SB 1396), the Sheriff and the Superior Court have drafted a new Agreement that will be in effect through June 30, 2006, with an option to renew annually thereafter by Amendment. County Counsel has approved the Agreement as to form.

Pursuant to SB 1396 and Government Code Sections 669925 and 69926, the new Agreement specifies that the Superior Court and the Sheriff will develop an annual or multiyear Trial Court Comprehensive Security Plan, which will include a mutually agreed upon law enforcement security plan covering all County court facilities. The Judicial Council will specify the subject areas to be addressed in the plan and the most efficient practices for providing security services.

The Sheriff has also agreed to present the results of a security staffing needs assessment with a corresponding funding request to the Court by April 30 each year. This funding request will be documented with the nature, extent and basis of all allowable costs. The Sheriff and the Court will agree, in writing, to a level of funding for the upcoming fiscal year. Actual court security allocations will be subject to the approval of the Judicial Council and the funding provided by the Legislature.

Finally, based on the results of a midyear evaluation of security expenses, modifications may be made to the security budget, upon mutual consent.
