SUBJECT: Cooperative Agreement with Southern California Edison Company, Relocation of Conflicting Utilities, Interstate 15 & Cantu-Galleano Ranch Road Interchange

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

That the Board approve the submitted Utility Agreement between the County of Riverside and the Southern California Edison Company for the relocation of electrical utilities which are in conflict with the planned interchange improvements at Interstate 15 and Cantu-Galleano Ranch Road, and authorize the Chairman of the Board to execute the agreement on behalf of the County of Riverside.

BACKGROUND:

The Transportation Department is currently finalizing plans and specifications and other project requirements for the construction of interchange improvements at Interstate 15 and Cantu-Galleano Ranch Road (formely Galena Street). The submitted agreement provides for the relocation of conflicting electrical facilities by the Southern California Edison Company at the expense of the County of Riverside.
