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The Agreement is necessary to formalize the transfer of necessary rights-of way and to provide for District construction inspection of the Salt Creek - Silicate Drive Storm Drain associated with Tract Nos. 28789 and 28790.

Upon completion of the project construction, the District will assume ownership, operation and maintenance of the mainline storm drain. The County will assume ownership, operation and maintenance of the associated catch basins, connector pipes and laterals within the road right-of-way which are to be maintained by the County.

County Counsel has approved the Agreement as to legal form and the Developer has executed the Agreement.

This matter is also on the District's Board Agenda this same date.
