SUBJECT: Request for Authorization to Pay Flood Emergency Costs

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

Authorize the District to pay KEC Engineering for all work done to save and stabilize the Limonite Bridge structure and Day Creek flood control channel from flood damage related to the storms of October 20 and 21, 2004.

BACKGROUND:

Storm runoff from thunderstorm activity on October 20 and 21, 2004 caused severe erosion to the southerly side of the Limonite Avenue bridge structure. Further damage occurred at the bridge abutments at the 64th Street and Holmes Avenue bridges as well as to Day Creek Channel itself. Damage to the Limonite Avenue bridge structure was extensive, resulting in the closure of Limonite Avenue to all vehicular traffic. KEC Engineering was brought in on an emergency basis to save the bridge, and to fortify the channel downstream. Costs associated with the emergency work effort are estimated at \$900,000.
