SUBJECT: California Healthcare for Indigents Program (CHIP) Hospital Contracts, Fiscal Year 2003-2004

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

- 1) Ratify the Medical Services Agreements for the County Network Hospitals for the period of July 1, 2003, through June 30, 2004.
- 2) Direct the Clerk of the Board to retain one (1) original of each agreement and return two (2) fully executed originals of each agreement to FIS/MISP, Administration.

BACKGROUND: The California Healthcare for Indigents Program (CHIP) was established by Assembly Bill (AB) 75 (Chapter 1331, Statutes of 1989) and amended by AB 99 (Chapter 278, statutes of 1991) in order to promote the provision and expansion of health services to indigents. The bill provides Medically Indigent Services Program (MISP) counties with funds from Hospitals, Physicians, and Unallocated accounts of the Cigarette and tobacco Products surtax fund created by Proposition 99. Monies from the various accounts have different allowable uses and must be accounted for separately.

BACKGROUND (Continued):

The particular monies funding these contracts are designated by the State of California as owing to the assigned hospitals in exchange for indigent care services and information on the access of those services.

Hospitals included in the County Network are as follows:

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The Riverside County CHIP allocation for formulary hospitals for fiscal year 2003-2004 is \$10,717.

Past CHIP formulary hospital contract allocations have been as follows:

The projected revenues from the CHIP allocations have declined in the past due to state action to reallocate these funds from counties to other state programs.

The submission of these contracts for approval was delayed due to the late submissions of the signed contracts from the Hospitals. The last contract notification was not received until December 7, 2004.

These contracts have been reviewed and approved for form by County Counsel.
