4. Formally adopt the Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District Master Plan, dated August, 1999. (Attachment F of the report)
5. Direct the Executive Office, working in cooperation with EDA and the Parks District staffs, to participate in the Recreation and Park District Working Group and report to the Board on issues of joint interest.

**BACKGROUND:**

On September 28, 2004 (M.O. 3.3), the Board of Supervisors requested that the Executive Office, in cooperation with the Riverside County Regional Parks and Open Space District and County Service Area Administrators, report to the Board on options available to the County for assuming responsibilities for recreation and park services in the County's urbanized, unincorporated communities. The Board initiated this request because of the growing need for adequate park and recreational services given the rapid growth in the County's population.

The attached report was prepared with the assistance of staff from each Supervisor's office, County Parks, EDA, County Planning, County Counsel, Local Agency Formation Commission, Jurupa Community Services District and the Beaumont-Cherry Valley, Coachella Valley, Jurupa Area, and Valley-Wide Recreation and Park Districts. The report summarizes the local Quimby requirements (Ordinance 460, Section 10.35) and provides a short description of current local providers of recreation and park services, including: Recreation and Park Districts, CSAs, County Parks, Jurupa Community Services District and Homeowners Associations. The report also includes information regarding the process for dissolving a district.

In Attachments B and C, the report includes the FY 03-04 Quimby Reports for the Recreation and Park Districts and CSAs 143 and 145. It should be noted that the Coachella Valley Recreation and Park District is working to resolve three years of deficit budgeting and is using its current Quimby fees to repay past capital improvement expenditures. The Beaumont-Cherry Valley Recreation and Park District requests the Board's adoption of a Master Plan amendment (Attachment D) that establishes the ratio of five acres/1000 residents to address recreation and park needs in its area.

The Beaumont-Cherry Valley, Coachella, Jurupa Area, and Valley-Wide Recreation and Park Districts are preparing new Master Plans that will be brought to the Board for adoption in 2005. In the interim, formal adoption of the 1998 Coachella Valley Recreation and Park District Master Plan (Attachment E) and 1999 Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District Master Plan (Attachment F) is requested.

The report recommends that the County Executive Office, County Parks, and EDA staff participate in the Recreation and Parks District Working Group to facilitate improved compliance with Ordinance 460 and share funding strategies. Issues of mutual concern will be forwarded to the Board for its consideration.
