SUBJECT: Riverside CAL-ID Purchase of Automated Fingerprint Identification System Equipment

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors approve the transfer of \$205,250 from the Riverside CAL-ID local trust account to the Riverside/San Bernardino regional trust account for a joint purchase with San Bernardino CAL-ID of Automated Fingerprint Identification System Equipment.

BACKGROUND: As a part of a joint purchase with San Bernardino CAL-ID, approved by the Riverside CAL-ID Remote Access Network Board on August 16, 2004 (See Attachment A), Riverside CAL-ID will purchase eight live scans, three printers and upgrades to existing equipment that will total \$205,250.

The devices will be placed in the Sheriff's Jurupa Valley and Palm Desert Stations, the Hall of Justice, the Larson and Southwest Justice Centers, and the Blythe, Cathedral City and Hemet Police Departments.

This purchase will be made entirely with AB 879 funds, a \$1 surcharge on County vehicle registration that is earmarked for the replacement and upgrades of the local automated fingerprint identification system.

RIVERSIDE CAL-ID REMOTE ACCESS NETWORK
MEETING MINUTES: September 15, 2004

Jurupa Valley Station, Hemet Police, Palm Desert Station, Blythe Police and Cathedral City Police

The live scan devices at all of these facilities are in need of replacement due to age and OS2 or NT operating systems. Each of these locations, with the exception of Blythe PD, is also equipped with a photo capture station. The Jurupa Valley and Palm Desert Station devices serve a dual purpose of applicant and criminal printing. The Hemet and Cathedral City Police devices are in secure areas and used solely for criminal prints. Staff suggests replacing all but the Cathedral City Police device with TP3100 desktop live scans. Due to their higher volume, staff suggests installing a TP3800 palm system in Cathedral City and the three regional courts (HOJ, Larson, Southwest).

On Monday, August 16, 2004, Lt. Hall contacted the Board to obtain approval to move forward with the purchase of eight live scans and three printers in conjunction with a joint purchase with San Bernardino CAL-ID. The following Board members voted their approval; Sheriff Bob Doyle, Chief Clay Hodson, Mary Moreland, Deputy Chief Andy Pytlak and Mayor Larry Dressel. Chief Bob Whitney and Chief Stan Henry were not available.
