3 AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE
4 AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 452
5 RELATING TO PRIMA FACIE SPEED LIMITS

6 The Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside do ordain as follows:

7 Section 1. Section 2.3 (Thirty-five miles per hour) is amended to include the
8 following:

9 77. On Washington Street between Mariposa Avenue and Van Buren
10 Boulevard, a total distance of approximately 0.68 mile, in the Lake
11 Mathews area.

12 78. On Jurupa Road between Valley Way and Mission Boulevard, a total
13 distance of approximately 0.4 mile, in the Glen Avon area.

14 Section 2. Section 2.5 (Forty-five miles per hour) is amended to include the
15 following:

16 102. On Jurupa Road between Pyrite Street and Valley Way, a total distance
17 of approximately 1.3 miles, in the Glen Avon area.

18 103. On Garbani Road between Antelope Road and Menifee Road, a total
19 distance of approximately 1.0 mile, in the Murrieta area.

20 104. On Pourroy Road between Murrieta Hot Springs Road and Serrento
21 Road, a total distance of approximately 1.1 miles, in the French Valley
22 area.

23 105. On Ramon Road between Monterey Avenue and Desert Moon Drive, a
24 total distance of approximately 0.5 mile, in the Thousand Palms area.

SUBJECT: Ordinance No. 452.220 to establish speed zones enforceable by radar speed detection equipment – Glen Avon, French Valley, Lake Mathews, Murrieta, Perris, Thousand Palms, and Woodcrest areas

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board introduce Ordinance No. 452.220, amending Ordinance No. 452 relating to prima facie speed limits to establish various speed zones in the above-referenced areas of Riverside County.

BACKGROUND: Transportation Department staff has conducted Engineering and Traffic Surveys (E&TS) for various roads in the subject areas, as required by the California Vehicle Code.

Based upon the results of the E&TS for these roads, the radar-enforceable speed limits recommended by the Department are summarized in the attached tables.

It is recommended that the Board adopt this amendment at the next regularly scheduled meeting.

County Counsel has approved the ordinance amendment.

Transportation Department staff has contacted the Riverside, Temecula, and Indio Area offices of the California Highway Patrol regarding the proposed speed zones.
