**SUBJECT:** Amendment to Ordinance 784, an Ordinance of the County of Riverside Creating the Riverside County Children and Families Commission (Prop 10) Pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130100.

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board of Supervisors take the following actions:

1. Introduce and at the following meeting adopt Ordinance No. 784.6.
2. Upon the effective date of Ordinance No. 784.6, direct the Clerk of the Board to post the notice of vacancy of the Commission position, and close the posting period after ten (10) working days have elapsed.
3. Direct the Clerk of the Board to forward all letters of interest, or similar correspondence for the vacancy on the Commission to the Executive Director of the Commission for evaluation and recommendation back to the Board of Supervisors for a potential appointee to fill the vacancy.
4. Request the Executive Director of the Commission to respond back to the Board of Supervisors within forty five (45) days of the receipt of all documents from the Clerk of the Board.

**BACKGROUND:** The Riverside County Children and Families Commission was established by this Board in the adoption of Ordinance 784, enacted on January 22, 1999. The Commission implements the provisions of Proposition 10, which mandated early childhood programs funded from revenue on tobacco products.
