BACKGROUND: County is the lead agency for landscape and architectural improvements proposed to be constructed at the Interstate 10 at Monterey Avenue and Washington Street Interchanges. On October 25, 2004, the Board of Supervisors authorized the advertisement soliciting bids for the improvements and on December 1, 2004 bids were received and opened by the Transportation Department.

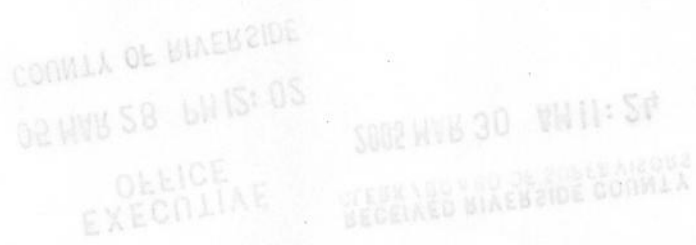

**RE: Interstate 10 at Monterey Avenue and Washington Street Interchanges Cooperative Agreement between the County of Riverside, the State of California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) and the City of Palm Desert for maintenance of landscape improvements.**

**Page: 2 of 2**

Funding for the improvements are primarily provided through a Transportation Enhancement Activities (TEA) Grant and maintenance will ultimately be provided by Caltrans. The terms of this agreement provide, in part, that the County will advertise, award and administer a construction contract for the improvements and Caltrans will assume maintenance responsibilities for the Monterey Avenue interchange after four years and the Washington Street interchange after twenty years. The agreement additionally stipulates that maintenance during the period between the completion of construction and the beginning of Caltrans maintenance will be the responsibility of the City of Palm Desert. Funding for the maintenance provided by the City of Palm Desert will be obtained through a cooperative effort of local agencies including the City of Rancho Mirage, City of La Quinta, City of Indian Wells and the City of Palm Desert. The terms and conditions of this cooperative funding effort will be defined by separate agreement between the local agencies.
