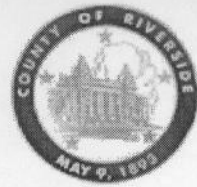

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to Subtitle B of the Stewart B. McKinley Homeless Act of 1987 (Public Law 100-77), the City of Riverside has been awarded Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) funds for the operation and maintenance of emergency shelter facilities. In accordance with program requirements, the City of Riverside would like to partner with DPSS and enter into a two-part agreement for the period of July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005 according to the terms and conditions stated below.

• **MEN'S AND FAMILIES' SHELTERS**

The City of Riverside will provide DPSS the sum of \$85,340 in ESG funds and \$214,660 in CDBG funds. DPSS has contracted with the Institute for Urban Research and Development to operate and maintain a 50-bed emergency shelter for homeless men and a 50-bed emergency shelter for homeless families, both in the City of Riverside.

• **EMERGENCY COLD WEATHER SHELTER PROGRAM (ECWSP)**

The City of Riverside will provide DPSS the sum of \$56,894 in ESG funds to support the ECWSP program operating at the Riverside National Guard Armory. DPSS has contracted with the Path of Life Ministries to operate and maintain an emergency cold weather shelter at the Riverside National Guard Armory.

The effective date of July 1 is the City of Riverside's traditional start date for all funding agreements, which allows the County to charge any allowable expenses incurred since July 1, 2004.

Please note that the reason for the delay in bringing this to the Board is that the City usually provides the funding agreement to the County in the second half of the fiscal year after the contracts have been executed. This, in effect, allows the funding to catch up to the contracts without delaying the delivery of services to Riverside County residents.

The Board previously approved a similar City of Riverside ESG agreement on May 4, 2004 (#3.18) in the amount of \$174,950 for services provided at the Men's Shelter and the Emergency Cold Weather Shelter in Riverside.

FINANCIAL DATA:

Funds for operating the shelters have been included in the fiscal year 2004-05 budget.
