SUBJECT: Sole Source Purchase of Three Live Scan Devices for Riverside CAL-ID

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve the purchase of three Live Scan devices from Identix for a total purchase price of \$68,000, without securing competitive bids, in accordance with Ordinance 459.4.
2. Accept this and all purchases of hardware and software from Identix, DataWorks Plus and NEC as the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) standard for Riverside County and exempt the Purchasing Agent from the requirement to report future sole source purchases for proprietary software and hardware maintenance, upgrades and additions to this system upon approval of the Riverside CAL-ID Remote Access Network (RAN) Board.

BACKGROUND: On March 3, 2005, the Riverside CAL-ID Remote Access Network (RAN) Board approved the purchase of a palm capable Live Scan device for placement at the new Riverside Police Department headquarters on Magnolia Avenue, scheduled for completion in July 2005. The RAN Board also approved the purchase of two tabletop Live Scan devices that will be installed at the Moreno Valley and Norco Police Departments (See Attachment A).

The Palm Live Scan will cost \$38,000 with an annual maintenance cost of \$6,720. The tabletop devices cost \$15,000 each with an annual maintenance cost per device of \$3,150. These purchases and maintenance costs will be entirely defrayed with AB 879 funds.

AFIS is comprised of proprietary hardware and software provided by three companies: Identix, Dataworks Plus and NEC Technologies. Therefore, to ensure system compatibility, all system additions and upgrades are necessarily sole source with these firms. Acknowledging the system's configuration and requirements, the Sheriff's Department recommends, with County Purchasing and Information Technologies concurrence, that the Board accept all purchases of hardware and software from Identix, DataWorks Plus and NEC as the Automated Fingerprint Identification System standard for Riverside County and exempt the Purchasing Agent from the requirement to report future sole source purchases for proprietary software and hardware maintenance, upgrades and additions to this system upon approval of the Riverside CAL-ID Remote Access Network (RAN) Board. This sole source approval would remain in effect for the life of AFIS, as currently configured.

Price Reasonableness

The pricing for the current purchase from Identix utilizes the equipment prices obtained by the State through its Multiple Awards Schedule (C-MAS).

Riverside CAL-ID makes every effort to purchase hardware and software with San Bernardino CAL-ID to take advantage of volume discounts offered by Identix, Dataworks Plus and NEC Technologies.

Live Scan Requests

Staff received requests from both the Sheriff's Department Norco Office and the Moreno Valley Police Department. Both locations are requesting a tabletop live scan device. The Norco substation is not presently equipped with live scan technology. When fingerprinting is necessary, officers transport subjects to the Jurupa Valley Station. Norco estimates their capture numbers will be 200 applicants and 20 suspects this year. They rolled ink prints on 100 – 150 Parks and Recreation volunteers, 17 Norco Mounted Posse members, and 15 Norco Citizen Patrol applicants last year. Additionally, they referred 63 city employees to other locations for live scan fingerprinting.

The Moreno Valley Police Department has a live scan in their prisoner detention/processing area that is equipped with a photo capture device. In addition to their criminal and registrant processing, MVPD captures a large number of applicant prints each year. They are requesting a tabletop device for placement adjacent to their public lobby. MVPD estimates capturing 150 applicants per month. They processed 1,640 applicants in 2004.

Chief Pytlak also requested that the device at the Tyler Mall be removed due to the device not being used and an updated palm device be installed in their new facility on Magnolia Ave. that is under construction and due to be completed in July 2005.

A motion was made to approve the purchase of two desk top live scan devices and the purchase of a palm live scan for Riverside Police Departments new facility.
