SUBJECT: Ripley Water Treatment System Improvement Project

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors

1. Approve the construction documents for the Ripley Water Treatment System Improvement Project; and
2. Authorize the Economic Development Agency to advertise for bids and administer the project.

BACKGROUND:

The Ripley Water Treatment System Improvement Project consists of the installation of a new water treatment filtration system to reduce contaminants in the community's water supply. County Service Area 62's raw water supply is very high in iron-manganese as well as other contaminants; the current water quality cannot adequately attain minimum secondary standards.

Background (Continued):

The project will include the construction of an on-site filtration package facility, a 100,000 gallon water storage tank, booster pumps, and piping; the cleaning and repairing of existing equipment; and upgrading of the electrical, monitoring, and control systems.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved the construction documents as to form. Environmental reviews have been completed in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).

FISCAL IMPACT:

The project will be funded through USDA Rural Utility Services, Section 306 (c) Water and Wastewater Grant Funds for *Colonia* communities. There will be no impact on the County's General Fund.
