
**SUBJECT:** Resolution No. 2005-296

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** Adoption of Resolution No. 2005-296, Expressing a No Confidence Vote in Specific Members of the California State Assembly and California State Senate.

**BACKGROUND:**

Specific members of the California State Assembly and State Senate public safety committees have consistently abrogated their responsibility of providing for the public safety by voting against and essentially "killing" well written, well intentioned, legislation that would have enhanced protecting the public from high risk sex offenders.

Pursuant to their oath of office, these members of the State Legislature are responsible for and have sworn to provide for the public safety of the citizens of California. The abrogation of that duty warrants a vote of no confidence.

3 **RESOLUTION NO. 2005-296**  
4 **EXPRESSING A NO CONFIDENCE VOTE**  
5 **IN SPECIFIC MEMBERS**  
6 **OF THE CALIFORNIA STATE ASSEMBLY**  
7 **AND CALIFORNIA STATE SENATE**

9 WHEREAS, every public official in the State of California must take an oath of office,  
10 and,

11 WHEREAS, the oath of office ensures that a public official will uphold and defend the  
12 State and Federal Constitution and work on behalf of constituents to ensure a safe community  
13 over which they preside, which includes the health, safety and welfare of all Californians, and  
14

15 WHEREAS, the State laws and policies governing the release and monitoring of high  
16 risk sex offenders are ineffective, especially in notifying local law enforcement jurisdictions of  
17 pending releases of high risk sex offenders into the community, and successful monitoring of  
18 such sex deviants, and,

20 WHEREAS, members of the California State Assembly and California State Senate,  
21 public safety committees, are tasked with promoting new, better written, and responsible  
22 legislation to further protect the public from dangerous, high risk sex offenders, and

24 WHEREAS such responsible legislation has in fact been written, and considered, by  
25 members of the Assembly and Senate public safety committees, and

27 WHEREAS, specific members of the respective public safety committees have abrogated  
28 their responsibility by “killing” well written, well intentioned, legislation that would have  
29 enhanced protecting the public from high risk sex offenders, and

31 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of  
32 Riverside, that a **no confidence** vote be considered for the following members of the State

1 Assembly and State Senate for their efforts in "killing" responsible legislation such as the  
2 following: Assembly Bill No. (AB) 221 Bogh, AB 2068 Bogh, AB 730 Spitzer/Bogh, AB 1146  
3 Runner, AB 3097 Runner, AB 35 Spitzer, AB 438 Parra, Senate Bill No. (SB) 1049  
4 Hollingsworth, SB 1098 Hollingsworth, SB 722 Denham, SB 1074 Hollingsworth and other bills  
5 that would have enhanced the protection of innocent constituents from unsupervised and under-  
6 monitored high risk sex offenders:
