SUBJECT: Ratify Agreement with the California Emergency Medical Services Authority (EMSA) for the development of trauma and burn supply caches funded by the Health Resources Services Administration (HRSA), Hospital Bioterrorism Preparedness Program.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1) Ratify Agreement with the California Emergency Medical Authority (EMSA) for the period of June 6, 2005 through October 31, 2005 in the amount of \$381,816; and
- 2) Authorize the Chairperson of the Board to sign six (6) original copies of the Agreement.

BACKGROUND: The California Emergency Medical Services Authority (EMSA) is contracting with the Riverside County EMS Agency to purchase and develop trauma and burn caches for trauma centers in the County. This funding requires that caches be developed for Level I and Level II trauma centers only. Riverside County has three trauma centers that meet this criteria; Riverside

SUBJECT: Ratify Agreement with the California Emergency Medical Services Authority (EMSA) for the development of trauma and burn supply caches funded by the Health Resources Services Administration (HRSA) Hospital Bioterrorism Preparedness Program.

BACKGROUND: County Regional Medical Center (RCRMC), Riverside Community Hospital (RCH) and Desert Regional Medical Center (DRMC). Each of these hospitals will be provided with approximately \$114,000 worth of equipment and supplies in preparation for a potential surge in trauma or burn patients should a large scale disaster occur. Each cache will facilitate the immediate treatment and stabilization of up to 50 pediatric and adult trauma and burn patients. RCRMC, DRMC, and RCH will be required to develop procedures for the storage and utilization of the caches.

The caches will remain the property of the County and, under direction of the EMS Agency, will be available for transport to other impacted facilities during a disaster. Caches will be requested and transported in accordance with the Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS).
