SUBJECT: Ratify the Agreement #05-060 between Loma Linda University (LLU) and Community Health Agency (CHA).

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1) Ratify Agreement #05-060 between Loma Linda University and Community Health Agency, Department of Public Health, Office of Industrial Hygiene, in the amount of \$20,000 for the period of performance of September 1, 2004 through August 31, 2005. Thereafter, the term of the agreement may be extended for up to two (2) additional one (1) year terms, unless terminated, in the amount of \$20,000 annually; and
- 2) Authorize the Purchasing Agent to sign annual renewal amendments with anticipated revenue of \$20,000 through August 31, 2007; and
- 3) Authorize the Chairperson to execute four (4) originals of the Agreement on behalf of the County.

Subject: Ratify the Agreement #05-060 between Loma Linda University (LLU) and Community Health Agency (CHA).

BACKGROUND: (Continued)

Loma Linda University, School of Public Health, received a National Center for Environmental Health (NCEH) grant to create and operate an educational resource center. The main goal of the new center, called the Southern Pacific Environmental Resource Center (SPERC), is to provide Native Americans with technical and administrative assistance on environmental health service delivery issues.

This grant provides the opportunity to demonstrate that public-private partnerships, such as that between the Riverside County Department of Public Health and the LLU School of Public Health can provide value-added services to our citizens in a manner and quality not achievable by each partner institution operating in isolation. The Riverside County Department of Public Health was named as a partner.

The Office of Industrial Hygiene will be providing technical assistance, including fostering and maintaining partnerships with Native American Tribes, associated groups and federal government; providing assistance in the coordination of activities and delivery of Southern Pacific Environmental Resource Center (SPERC) program services; promoting program services providing training and consulting in such areas as lead abatement, indoor air quality, industrial and asthma triggers assessments; attending program meetings.

Justification for the Delay:

Due to Grant negotiations and start-up, along with contractual clarification and changes, this contract has been delayed. Final Contract from LLU was not received until December 2004, and has since been through the usual routing and approval process.

Financial Data:

Due to the difference in period of performance, our fiscal year, and the delay of the contract, there will be no revenue in FY 04/05.
