**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board of Supervisors approve the selection of the following consulting firms: DC Construction Management Services, Capstone Planning & Control, Inc., Ambient Environmental, Inc., INFOTOX, Inc. and Albert A. Webb Associates for use on an as needed basis and with negotiated fees not to exceed \$100,000 per project.

**BACKGROUND:** On April 18, 2005, the Department of Facilities Management, Design and Construction Division, advertised a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for various consultant related services including environmental services and cost estimating services. The RFQ was submitted for the purpose of developing a pool of qualified specialty consulting firms to perform work on minor capital and deferred maintenance projects on an as needed basis.

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**BACKGROUND:** (Continued)

Per Board Policy H-7 and Government Code, a selection committee made up of representatives from the Department of Facilities Management was established to review each firm's qualifications and interview selected firms. After reviewing all of the submitted qualifications and conducting interviews, five firms were selected on the basis of achieving at least a predetermined minimum collectively rated score. Each firm offers particular strengths that apply to the different types of projects directed by the Department of Facilities Management.

Creating a pool of qualified firms is in conformance with Board Policy H-7 for the purpose of being able to quickly respond to client needs and accelerate the delivery of projects. Services will be retained on an as needed basis via the issuance of a purchase order for negotiated services including, but not limited to, agreement on the scope of work, terms, conditions and compensation. Firms will be selected by Project Managers of the Department of Facilities Management based on the pre-qualified firm's current workload and the firm's particular qualifications for individual projects.

It is anticipated the size of projects with which the firms may be involved could range from approximately \$10,000 to \$1,500,000 with an average project value of \$100,000. The fees for the various projects will range from \$500 to \$100,000 with most averaging around \$8,000.
