BACKGROUND: The Board adopted resolutions establishing the formation of these Community Facilities Districts to provide specified infrastructure facilities, authorize the issuance of bonds to finance those facilities, and authorize the levy of special taxes to repay those bonds. The Board also adopted ordinances pertaining to the collection of the special taxes and the initiation of action in Superior Court to foreclose on any parcel for failure to pay the special taxes. 3 RESOLUTION NO. CFD 2005-20

4 **RESOLUTION OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 86-1 (MENIFEE VILLAGE) OF**
5 **THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE ORDERING THAT ACTION BE BROUGHT IN SUPERIOR**
6 **COURT TO FORECLOSE ON CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY FOR DEFAULT OF PAYMENT**
7 **OF SPECIAL TAX**

8 **WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside (respectively, the "Board" and
9 the "County") on behalf of Community Facilities District No. 86-1 (Meniffee Village) of the County (the
10 "District"), by Resolution No. 2000-40 that was adopted on January 25, 2000, authorized the issuance and
11 sale of Series 2000 Special Tax Revenue Bonds (the "Series 2000 Bonds") pursuant to the terms of the
12 Indenture dated as of February 1, 2000, by and between the County and U.S. Bank Trust National
13 Association, as Trustee, (the "Indenture") to refund in part special tax improvement bonds that had
14 previously been issued and sold to finance the construction of certain improvements within the District,
15 and to provide for the financing of additional authorized public facilities; and

16 **WHEREAS**, the County of Riverside, by the terms of the Indenture, covenants to timely initiate
17 foreclosure proceedings against any parcel in the District for default of payment of the special tax levied
18 to repay the principal and interest on the Bonds;

19 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, FOUND, DETERMINED AND ORDERED** by
20 the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, California, acting *ex-officio* as the Legislative Body
21 for Community Facilities District No. 86-1 (Meniffee Village) of the County of Riverside and
22 Improvement Area No. 1 thereof, in regular session assembled on September 13, 2005, that:

23 1. The parcels within the District, listed on the attached Exhibit "A" are delinquent for the
24 amounts shown as of the date shown.

25 2. Pursuant to Government code Section 53356.2 of the California Government Code, the
26 Auditor-Controller of the County, in cooperation with the County Executive Office and the Special
27 Counsel, as designated below, is to:

28 a.) cause the Treasurer-Tax Collector of the County to be credited upon the current tax
roll with the amounts of the delinquent special taxes to be sued upon, including applicable penalties,

1 interest, and cost, and is to be relieved of further duty in regard thereto; and

2 b.) request that the Treasurer-Tax Collector of the County cause all inquiries regarding
3 payment of the delinquent special tax installments to be forwarded to the Special Counsel.

4 3. The designated Special Counsel, Sherman & Feller, is directed to bring action in Superior
5 Court to foreclose against the parcels listed in Exhibit "A" for the amounts shown.


