

BACKGROUND:

On October 11, 2003, Governor Davis approved Senate Bill 621 (Battin and Burton), which established a method for distributing Indian Gaming Special Distribution Funds (SDF) to local government agencies impacted by tribal gaming. On December 2, 2003, agenda item 3.4, your Board established the Indian Gaming Local Community Benefit Committee (CBC), which is responsible for establishing all policies and procedures for local grant applications and the funding award process.

Local government agencies impacted by tribal casinos made application, with tribal sponsorship, to the CBC for grant funding from Individual Tribal Casino Accounts (ITCA). The first priorities for receipt of grant funds include: law enforcement, fire services, emergency medical services, environmental impacts, water supplies, waste disposal, behavioral health, planning and adjacent land uses, public health, roads, recreation/youth programs, and child care programs. State-wide, the amount of funding available for allocation in fiscal year 2004/05 was \$30 million.

On June 27, 2005 the CBC made their recommendations for distribution of approximately \$12.5 million (Riverside County's share) in mitigation grants. The Transportation and Land Management Agency (TLMA) Building and Safety Department was awarded \$245,214 for the Code Enforcement Community Enhancement Program (Identifier AU2-05).

With this award, the Building and Safety Department's Code Enforcement division will provide increased assistance to local residents through its Community Enhancement Program. Working with a tribal liaison and members of the surrounding community, the program will improve the quality of life for the citizens as well as eliminate identified hazards associated with older existing housing stock. In addition to the decreased potential for loss of property and life, the program will work to reduce accumulated materials in yards and open fields and inoperable vehicles, which will help make the housing stock more attractive, raise home values, and create a better sense of security for visitors to an Indian gaming facility.
