SUBJECT: Ratify the First 5 Riverside Agreement 06-20 OP between Riverside County Children and Families Commission and the Department of Public Health, Community Health Agency Nutrition Services Branch.

BACKGROUND: Riverside County Community Health Agency Department of Public Health, Nutrition Services Branch received a grant award from Riverside County Children and Families Commission (RCCFC) in the amount of \$761,530. Under this sixth year of funding, Nutrition Services' WIC Expansion program will:

- a) Provide nutrition assessments, education, food instrument vouchers, healthcare, immunization, and other appropriate community resource referrals to 3,000 program participants, in addition to State caseload, who receive services at Rob Reiner, Arlanza, Palm Desert, and Mecca WIC Clinics.

On August 12, 2005, this Agreement was received from RCCFC and preparation of this Form 11 began.

This Agreement has been approved as to form by County Counsel.
